Let's also applaud curator, Linda Lessner, who has done a masterful job of bringing so many different subjects, styles and mediums together so harmoniously. And kudos to our ace photographer Herb Fogelson for capturing the paintings so magically!

We lead off with **Robert Halasz**' "Goodbye Buenos Aires," oil on canvas. Using muted colors and a very strong design approach to various buildings, rooftops and other structures, Halasz brings the viewer into the

environment of city life. There is a mesmerizing quality to what this artist is saying about that special world. **Yukako** brings two vibrant acrylics on canvas board to the show, "Fuchsia" and "Marigold." Both are exuberant

abstracts, bursting with swirls of color. It's easy for viewers to feel they are strolling through magnificent gardens right there in the middle of Broadway!

We see beautiful vistas of water, hills and flowers in three of the watercolors by **Clare Stokolosa**, "Wild Flowers," "Oregon," and "View From the Piazza." One wants to somehow step into these paintings. In the fourth painting, "Mangia & Beve," we are treated to a luscious looking repast - and yes, I'll have that glass of red wine, please!

Deborah Yaffe brings two mixed-media still lifes to the gallery. Still life paintings in the right hands can be very powerful. There is no question that "Still Life - Flowers" and "Still Life - Fruit" are in the right hands! Both paintings on white backgrounds with black frames are presented somewhat simply but the actual effect is quiet drama.

A combo of acrylic and newsprint is **Richard Carlson**'s offering and the result is utterly fascinating. The newsprint inserts are so subtle that one "discovers" them while perusing the painting. This brings a very special surprise to the viewer. Carlson also uses a subdued palette which enhances the mystery of "Untitled - 5."

Carole Barlowe's three acrylics on linen, "The Hood," "City-Heads," and "Red Light Green Light - Caution," couldn't be more intriguing. It's been a pleasure watching this artist evolve into the current method she is using to create her pictures: simple, yet highly provocative silhouettes of human heads on either black or white backgrounds. The "people" are anything but quiet - they seem, at least to this viewer, to have plenty to say to each other and to the world!

It isn't often we see wall structures at the Mall, but we're seeing them in this show thanks to **Frank Gioeli**. "Napeague," "Peconic," and "Sagaponack" bring a new kind of excitement to the WSAC, which might inspire more artists to take this journey. Gioeli uses wood, metal, poly fiber and acrylic paint to enhance his work and this results in high drama at its best. It's easy to picture any one of the sculptures on a stark white wall in a modern New York apartment.

We usually think of pastels as a perfect medium for lovely, serene paintings. Well, think again! **Mary Hogan** has four dark and mysterious pastels on view at the Mall. Shown together, "Leaves," "It's a Cabbage," "Small Cabbages," and "More Leaves," while a tad disturbing are very, very seductive. And certainly a new way of thinking of pastels!

Peter Salwen brings two oil on linen panel cityscapes, full of luscious color and great design, "DUMBO: Manhattan Bridge from Front Street, Brooklyn" and "Brooklyn and East River Bridges from Courthouse Square." (I'm a sucker for bridges)! What is especially intriguing is Salwen's sense of perspective which gives even more scope to these exciting cityscapes.

We are in a new age of art and art presentation. **Dennis Wunderlin** brings us into that new age with 4 digital prints: "Pink," "FOLDEROL," "sevenandseven," and "FRANCOAMERICAN." These are four simple but strong abstractions - or are they abstractions??? This viewer is unable to answer that question but does it matter? What matters is standing in front of an artwork and enjoying it on one's own level. And that I did!

Linda Lessner, curator extraordinaire and pastel painter very extraordinaire, presents "Cliff" and "Night Time Tree." Both paintings are dense with mystery. The deep greens and complex vegetation create a strange, palpable sensuality. Who hasn't wandered into a wooded area and been just a bit uncomfortable but also, somewhat at home? I see both of these experiences in Lessner's work.

Next we have **Ava Schonberg**'s very bucolic country paintings which give us the other side of nature and the landscape. "Provence - Eze," "Arles - Provence," Provence - Eze," and "One Rainy Afternoon" are charming renditions of life in this special part of the world. The artist's loving acrylic portraits of these locations is a beautiful tribute to all of them.

Amy Rosenfeld brings two acrylic works to the gallery, "Painted Gift Bag" and "3D Pink Squares." Rosenfeld also reminds us that any subject is a painting waiting to happen! As in "Painted Gift Bag" - yes a gift bag! And giving the subject a handsome frame further enhances its importance as a subject. "3D Pink Squares" is a small but strong wall sculpture.

The six oils by **Ronnie Seiden-Moss** are strongly executed landscapes, some of them of locations in Central Park. "Central Park in Early Spring," "Winter Lake," "Color," "Forest Snow," "Big Sky," "Flower Triptych," and "Two Fences" reinforce the value of landscape painting by an experienced artist who obviously has a love affair with the outdoors.

To curator, Linda Lessner and to all the superb artists listed above, we wish you great artistic success in 2016!
