**Susie Lang** brings us eight beautifully realized portraits of mature women whom she elegantly captures as distinct personalities of style and grace. These photos are part of a series of studies of women Lang is doing on a continuing basis. We look forward to seeing more of her unique work.

**Barry Pinchefsky** delights us with his pictures of spectacular birds of Central Park with close-up shots of hawks in ravine and ramble along with ducks, the talk of our town, the Hooded Merganser and the Mandarin. All strut their regal colors on the park's lakes and tree limbs.

**Daniel C. Boyer**'s camera contributes two photographic studies of his wife Silvia, where his lens lovingly embraces his wife's beauty. His better half, **Silvia Soares Boyer**, regales us with scenes from her beloved home, Portugal, in pictures of an imposing Lisbon monument and remembrances of Porto, her hometown.

**Jessica Nooney** digitally alters her photos to great effect in five pictures in the exhibit. Each piece is mesmerizingly deformed by this artist and I found "Reflections in a Wok," striking due to the broad range of alabasters and cerulean blues resulting from her creative manipulations.

In contrast to Pinchefsky's avian studies in nature, **Carolyn Reus** documents urban birds in murals on the sides of New York City buildings where one photo of a wonderful scarlet cardinal graces the outside wall of an apartment building, creating pictorial focus to prosaic windows of conforming dwellings.

Multi-talented **Nina Hellman** provides us with six atmospheric, painterly photographs, three of which are shots of her sculptures of people's heads, contemplative and simultaneously compelling, complimenting her other three pictures which are peaceful, dreamy landscapes.

**Laurens McKenzie** adds four diverse photos to the exhibit, one of which appears to be protesters making a statement in front of The White House for all to see along with a unique composition in linear arrangement of jazz musicians, perhaps waiting to perform in their dress-white suits. These two pieces contrast with a sensitive picture of a flower along with one work entitled, "Bird Shot."

**Gayle Pickard-Fishman** brings us six depictions of our very varied city with Manhattan as a bustling center in Times Square, a serene Fifth Avenue outside the borders of Central Park, a dilapidated construction site and a moment of New York early springtime captured in daffodils poking bravely through the snow in a planter at Bryant Park.

Catherine Blewer engages viewers with great scenes of Cuba, a destination long embargoed to United States visitors, opening Americans to a world from which they were long denied access. Blewer captures one of the signatures of Havana life in her picture of a woman by a vintage car that has been kept running by the skills of that city's engineers, both amateur and professional, along with a quiet scene of a couple enjoying refreshments on the patio of the Hotel Nacional de Cuba.

**Richard Ayala** cooks up a piquant sauce of intricate photos of New York City where the interest is contained in the details. He embraces compassionately and vibrantly the underside of our town that we experience in some form on a daily basis, with a photojournalistic eye where black and white scenes bring forth the most unsung aspects of people and places in our gritty metropolis.

Open 2019 was a terrific foray to herald the new year at The West Side Arts Coalition. The exhibit showcased a broad range of talents and subjects of which I was fortunate to experience in all its grandeur at The Broadway Mall Community Center. Eagerly, I cheer, "Onward to many more great shows!"
