## New Plaza Cinema : A **Non-Profit Cinema on** the Upper West Side

Here on the west side of Manhattan, there is a new nonprofit, largely volunteer organization entitled New Plaza Cinema, created in response to the closing of the legendary Lincoln Plaza Cinemas. In the past year, New Plaza has been showing the same films that Lincoln Plaza would have shown, but now, in the spacious auditorium of the New York Institute of Technology (NYIT) on Broadway between 61st & 62<sup>nd</sup> Streets.

As an expression of confidence in the organization, NYIT has provided its facilities for two weekends every month, starting November 2<sup>nd</sup> to show independent and foreign films up until May 2020. In addition, Harvard Business School Community Partners is collaborating with New Plaza so that eventually they may have a permanent film venue.

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The exhibition started with two artworks of artist **Margarita Ballester**, who presented to us a rhythmical acrylic artwork in autumn colours, "The Snake Dance," and an organized mixed media titled "Magic Mask," reflecting an overwhelmingly creative face enhanced by acrylic, lace, and mirrors.

**Robert N. Scott** brought to the gallery a powerful acrylic on paper entitled "Source Reflections" that feels like touching a powerful system of planets in orbit. "Sea Breeze" and "Winter Flora," watercolors, present scenes of calmness and frozen intensity.

By contrast came the painting of **Nancy Johnson**, "Before the Snow," This strong oil on canvas showing a dense forest combines the touch of rich textures and a thick palette of reds and blue-turquoise with notes of beauty and romanticism.

A gentle path through warm soft pastel-season colors, "A Touch of Gold" and "Gold Fever," comes in next, with the artist **Nate Ladson.** "Sisters" and "The Poet," astonishing paintings in oil and oil reproduction, also bring up the impressive and experienced figurative facet of this artist. The spectator can definitely observe the versatility in these four artworks.

There is a willingness to make a toast to the gallery with a reference to landscapes, with **Nina Hellman**. Her watercolor and gouache artwork "The Departure," is beautifully represented in an extremely large and dramatic form. Located on the back wall of the gallery, it strikes the viewer with its portentous scale. This painting brings an interesting rhythm to the composition, letting it breathe in calmness.

Our next artist, **Georgianna Grantham**, brought to the gallery two acrylics on canvas. "Celebration of Life" transmits a colorful freedom through vibrant brushstrokes and "A City Behind the Gates" leads the spectator to a dramatic scenario represented by cold-black and undulating forms against a city in yellow.

With the presence of this show's curator **Sonia Barnett** came also her own art versions with "Free Expression Collage 1" and "Free Expression Collage 2." These mixed media on canvas -- lace and fabric and printmaking respectively -- accurately inspired what I can consider a quadriptych of innocence and purity. These patterns show us, doubtlessly, cheerful thoughts in perfect harmony.

**Gwen Black** surprised me with her skilled and pleasurable artworks with ink and tissue paper on wood. In "Nate 'Tiny' Archibald" her expertise enhances the Basketball Hall of Famer with a dynamic image of this professional athlete. With "Latin Jazz Legends" she brings a remarkable tribute with educated mastery, giving importance to her own routes and love for Jazz.

Going forth to the next artist, **Mildred Borras** amazingly delivers social and nature themes into the exhibition. "At the Bus Station," an oil on canvas, shows us a scene of an African-American woman seated on a bench with a thinking expression; the acrylic "A Woman" shows us a sensual white feminine figure from the back wearing a short black dress. The acrylic "Blue Mountains" presents evocative rectangular and curvilinear formations consolidated with a strong gradation of colours that transported me to a calm landscape scenario.

**Petronia Paley**, presented us with three wood work series "Blue," "Dancing," and "Hero." These rich and creative mixed-media artworks are a good example of elements and contrast. The first one lives through a representation of a blue mask with gold details and native red and green feathers; the second one lured my imagination to a feminine eroticism against a golden background and the third one transported me into a super-universe where serenity and innocence are holding hands to reach a majestic balance.

We reach our finale, giving emphasis to artist **Carol Rickey** with her "Untitled I," "Meeting," and "On a Roll." These watercolors on paper unreel in an abstract style, insinuating forms of objects and people where magentas and greens, among other fresh tints, have their singularity to reach a perfect harmony through the defined lines of construction.

"Free Expression 2019" gave an extraordinary and genuine trail to these eleven truly talented artists! I congratulate you all for your commitment, expertise and desire to share your art at Broadway Mall Gallery.
