



Celia Cruzado's semi-Cubist collages, "Through the Looking Glass", "Reflections", and "Fugitive", put strong solemn faces in the midst of unrelated objects. "Looking Glass" contains written pieces such as 'The Answer is No', while in the enigmatic "Reflections" a man and an apartment building are separated by a field of geometric shapes and impenetrable color. "Fugitive" is an assembled world in which two faces are partially hidden.

In Yukako's "I Am Here" and "I Will Live" bursts of color state the themes. "I Am Here" has a dazzling red field with a white square in the middle that anchors the composition. "I Will Live" is a study in contrast as the main blue shape resembles a fragile bubble, while its feeling is an emphatic statement. An interesting feature of "I Will Live" is an off-center vertical line. It is reminiscent of the vertical lines Barnett Newman used to symbolize humanity's struggle against destruction.

In "On the Science of Pentagrams" **Silvia Soares Boyer** shows a tightly geometric painting in yellow and white against a black background. The five-sided pentagram is explored in whole shapes and exploded shapes. The title is ironic in that the pentagram is derived from pure mathematics, but it's had a strong spiritual meaning through the centuries, which idea is reinforced by the crystals outlining the shape.

Surrealist **Daniel C. Boyer**'s "The Wimpy Island Remains Silent at the Slander of the Radio" is a pen and ink drawing surrounded by a blue mat decorated with a gel pen. This complex construction suggests an island surrounded by water, but leaves the interpretation of the drawing to the viewer. "The Two Iraqi Boys" is an example of entopic graphomania, automatic drawing in the Surrealist tradition.

In **Arlene Finger**'s pastel "Everywhere Leaves" free-flying leaves have escaped from two figurative potted plants, and these oval leaves quickly engage the viewer's attention away from the pots. Their tones of black on gray are put to good use to create the sense of movement; using green in the composition would have grounded the leaves.

**Leanne Martinson**'s four oil/collages in "Homage to J. Chamberlin" are expressionistic vibrating images composed of lights and darks, shapes and lines. Using mainly primary colors in light hues, the contrasting black areas push the colors into motion with a great sense of exuberance.

In **Beatrice Rubel**'s "Rising Color, No. 7" colored pencil and graphite create alternating light and dark lines on the right, and these move into a cloud of alternating colors on the left that literally rises to the top and almost seems to fly away.

In **Anne Rudder**'s "Vortex" the focus is on a diagonal swath of primary colors against white that lead to a pink whirlpool with black center that invites the viewer to plumb its depths. Aside of the main focus is a figure of the outside of a vortex, a swirl of light red with a dark red whirlpool. The combination of the two has a magnetic pull on the viewer.

**Joseph Boss** shows the possibilities of line and color using push-pull technique to create depth. In "Motley Interiors" the viewer is invited into the depth of the three major elements by their colors and rounded shapes. In "Shapes in Motion" depth is created by an arrangement of relatively light colors against dark elements. In "Fiery Sublime" amorphous random shapes, words, and numbers circle around a central fixed image of bright solid red which brings the disparate images together.

**Emily Rich**'s "Black and White" series of seven paintings bring to mind de Kooning's and Franz Kline's (and others') belief in the power of gestural black and white brush strokes to express emotion. These paintings suggested several things to my eye such as otherworldly landscapes, a group of musicians, machinery. No doubt each viewer will see different things in the paintings but all will feel their strong expressiveness.

**Dammika D. Ranasinghe** displays four lively examples of pattern painting, "London Dungeon", "Blooming Flowers", "A Country Fair", and "Dancing with the Fire". The colors are laid down next to each other in the overall pattern, but they interact with each other dynamically to create the illusion of tactile surfaces.

The titles of **Francois Ilnseher**'s "Construction I", "Construction II", and "Construction III" have a playful double meaning. They are constructions in a painterly sense but also their subjects are buildings themselves of various kinds. Highly detailed paintings of buildings or parts of buildings are mixed with painted lines and jagged cut paper images. The softly painted background colors give the works a gentle feeling.
