Niki Khanam has "Zoraya in the Forest" a white and slightly transparent cloud sleeping in a dappled, leafy and small-flowered glen, and towards her slant and subtly-different angles, the shadows of trees, as if during the march of afternoon and its sun. In "The Rite," meanwhile, it is as if the libations of Hellenistic women, the centre grey-himationed, flow out with fish as if water streaking from an ancient and tangled Academy.

**Dennis Wunderlin**'s obliquely-named "Bagatelle," with sheet music, is one of the multicoloured and ambiguously mixed-media works in which collaged text an if from magazines and the compact dance of pencilled-in gesture. The light-turquoise and -green "Garden Party" has subtly-overlapping rectangles and oblongs fenced in one place by colour-register dots.

Frieda Christofides beautifully paints with watercolours the High Line's maligned oasis snaking and cropping up between high-rises and "Washington Square Park," where the republican sobriety of the Federal had given way to high-society enclaves. In her work there is the sense of sudden surprise as if flora erupts like pocket jungles in the urban, as with "Whitney With Flowers."

In **Lisa Kaplan**'s prints a "Bird" as if a haunting cyan ghost of xerography has a hovering perch as if against a negative bas-relief and sunken iron of bars and squiggled trails. In "Untitled," a disembodied aquamarine puma might almost be but it is not and he is overstamped with purple in a work ensigned with the press of a rectangle-bound curlicue

You can almost smell the needles of **Anthony Monitto**'s oil "Vermont Shapes," with the slightly northern feeling of the Group of Seven in its rendering of pines' harsh shadows falling by two white cabins of the secessionist New Connecticut. In "Sun-Splashed Room" it is not so much the splash of the sun but the shadows that creep and menace, curved rectangles thrown as from a and menace, curved rectangles thrown as from a passing train and passing across furniture perhaps including a chesterfield in a dark-green afternoon living-

Carol Rickey's cheerful, bright still lifes might be of dark plums ("Pink Lillies with Plums"), of coffee-makers and cups or might be of a spray or fan of red and golden tulips ("Spring Tulips in Blue Pitcher"), but what distinguishes them is the whimsy with which a monkey with bubblegum or a wooden doll might appear.

In **Preston Trombly**'s red and orange over cream acrylic on paper "Early Autumn" a spaghetti trace, marked or incised, drifts and meanders towards and circles away from the ground before abandoning its quest at an odd meeting between bold confidence and the collapse of melancholy resignation.

**Madeline Young**'s brightly-flowered trees near the convergence of gorgeously-blue rivers by a church well-shaded in bluish greys in the "French Countryside" show the bright, fresh energy of her acrylics. They are notable for details such as the bright lemon that enlivens "Red Table with Grapes" and the drooping weight of its yellow flowers or the dark pears on a table ("Whimsical Flowers with Pears") with the lovely blooms like decorative targets at once familiar but, again, never to be seen anywhere.

Clare Stokolosa dynamically paints mauve flowers among an effusion of white, green-leaved ones in her still life of "Fresh Flowers in Violet Vase," the violet vase leaning informally against a subtle background of many colours. In "Sleepy Day Along the Shore" she conveys the darkly intense or bright colours of houses that often curl along an ocean on overcast days.

Peter Salwen's "Spring Afternoon, Central Park West" is a masterful treatment of the delicate shadows that lie on light-grey pavement by dark-red turreted and red-brick buildings. He shows the remarkable ability to show the pooling and lightly splashing light that can illuminate the strollers in front of pastel and ochre vegetation on an "April Morning in Carl Schurz Park." Mr. Salwen gives us the precise feeling of the city at different times, seen by bicyclists or those who sit by the towering and somehow snowy-dusty blooms by John Finley Walk, and walking figures might even seem Korenesque from the effects of light and shadows.

The large tour-de-force that is **Jessica Alazraki**'s "Siesta" shows signs of a dominating talent. A father with face hat-covered dozes on his back by an open Cheetos bag and a skeleton of maize and flattened cigarette box while across the mother's face flirts a moment of disdain. Their daughter holds a limp cat with a long-suffering expression as the laziness of summer

The exhibition, with the freshness of its work by many artists, is the right one for this particular moment.
