Carole Barlowe's Tree Creatures present fallen pieces of tree bark & branches, painted, fastened and fashioned into hopefully amusing Tree Creatures.

Richard Carlson's hard-edged, clever geometric canvases appear more daring than ever. Spare use of color and composition enhance Richard's strengths.

Judith Davidoff's disc concert happily reached the ears of walkers, heads craning to find the origin of the music.

Robin Goodstein's colorful canvases and paper abstract creations caught the rapt attention of people strolling by who stopped for better viewing.

Georgianna Grantham's smiles of warm reception beckoned people to her table laden with gaily patterned place mats, scarves, carry bags, all designed to delight!

Deborah Holcombe showed four bold paintings. Three paintings were of exaggerated wine and drinking vessels and the other, a lovely tall transparent glass vase, held willowy petal sunburst blooms.

Linda Lessner's outdoor pastels interpret the seasons. Trees, grasses, mountains, water, and skies tenderly sketched, touch paper with familiar blues, greens, and shades of yellow/ecru, smoothed into reflections of the scenes. Social mailing cards of Linda's artwork were available.

Margo Mead's table covered with incised foil portraits of dogs, cats, and favored zoo pets drew many animal lovers. Also noticed were the few portraits of homo-sapiens. Margo's rack of watercolor work of cats and landscapes did not escape viewers and also received much

Todd Merchant's roundup of charming children depicted in living black pen-line drawings, captured memories of passers by.

Jesse Robinson's jazz inspired hard edge paintings remain unrestrained, in syncopated. contrapuntal rhythms, configured upon dangling key chains. Jesse's key chains orchestrate upon wind-up on your finger.

Marie Robison's card display attracted people intrigued by hand-made greeting cards. Marie's variety of design includes collage, watercolor scenes, funky black-pen figures, huggable animals and exuberant holiday drawings.

Ava Schonberg's paintings on canvas describe beach scenes, small dwellings, and familiar female figures. Lonely settings contemplate intuitive thoughts. Ava's smooth, cool palette provides a fulcrum for our treasured memories.

Jerry Shafer's watercolor and photography country scenes show a versatility in composition and interpretation, that is to be admired.
