Photographer and painter Leila Elias has traveled widely including the Kazakhstan homeland of her artist husband, Berik, and the pieces here document some of the places she has been such as Tokyo and far-flung Mongolia. She also gives us a gleaming picture of Lincoln Center at sunset as one enters the passageway to the New York City Ballet.

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Myrna Harrison-Changar displays her prodigious talents in two very different works, an exuberant montage of the day of the Gay Pride Parade along with a surrealistic photo of a young person's head as if in a dream, where the child looks beyond a limited horizon of the world of a rural countryside, the possibilities for living a broadened existence made endless by the act of dreaming.

Daniel C. Boyer's critical and knowledgeable eye caught him in Philadelphia with a photograph of the United Kingdom Coat of Arms, extremely worn in the picture so the viewer cannot see the double tressure flory counter flory in the Arms of Scotland, making the French-Scottish alliance debatable in its symbolism. Chevalier Boyer also provides a lovely picture of his wife, Silvia, along with a glowing light framing of a building in Saugerties, NY.

Silvia Soares Boyer provides us with two photos of her time studying in England with an atmospheric piece on William Shakespeare's birthplace in Stratford-on-Avon along with an imposing picture of the main building at Cambridge University in winter, a place of fond memories of her student days there.

One could readily identify David Reibman's unique photos because of their very creative layouts in picture frames. The pieces, the elements of each arranged in triplicate subject matter, delight the viewer with studies of a man in Buffalo, whimsical pictures of Halloween and colorful snapshots of the LOVE sculpture on the streets of New York City.

Dr. Barry Pinchefsky, like Leila Elias, is world traveled and shows us bathers soothing themselves in the springs of Revkjavik. Iceland along with providing viewers with a tribute to his deep Jewish faith in a picture of Rabbis, offering prayers at the Western Wall in Jerusalem. His contributions to the exhibit are complete with an exuberant picture of a young girl in Thailand.

Georgianna Grantham, besides developing her painterly visions at the WSAC, also is blooming as a photographer. Here, she grows her abilities of observation, capturing the New York City skyline along the East River near her apartment during the snowy days of drear mid-winter.

Ba Djibril Ngawa harkens back to the heritage of his formative years in Africa, documenting Fulani nomads in Benin and Mauritania in a world very different from the life he finds in New York. In this exhibit, he concentrates on the people tending to their herds in their rural homes through vivid color pictures.

Bob Merritt rounds out the exhibit in a wide range of subjects from immortalizing the World Trade Center to capturing the actors Faye Dunaway and Paul Newman in candid moments. This photographic group also provides stasis to fleeting moments in our wonderful city, among them, Merritt snapping a lone seagull on a fence by the harbor along with dramatic surrealistic depictions of an Hispanic woman and an abstract kaleidoscopic display of colors conjuring emotions the viewer might experience listening to The Rolling Stones' rendition of "Gimme Shelter."

Through my viewing of "Society & Travel," I enjoyed places I've never actually visited and met people I've physically not encountered, Daniel and Silvia Boyer bringing worlds near and far to me with this satisfying visual journey.
