**Anne Rudder**'s poetry art, "The God's Garment Balm," crayon and ink/paper, introduces viewers to Autumn Prelude 2018. Well chosen, timely, words aptly describe thoughtful meaning. Lives lost through careless and dangerous use of firearms MUST be addressed and ultimately STOPPED from occurring. Rudder's poetry is a worthy contribution. Art informs daily life!

Myrna Harrison-Changar, "Red Abstraction," collage. The artist's chosen collage papers were previously acquainted or the designer works creatively with her chosen scraps. The red wall button on the left eludes the shadowy figures on the lower right, who are awaiting the elevator. In the upper left, the drone of airplane noise seems focused upon the red-hot summer day. "Currants," is a scramble collage of game and theater tickets, also a beef liver ticket? The title Currants translates for me as current. So...select your choice quickly!

Sonia Barnett's acrylic/canvas paintings excel in brushy paint strewn style. In "Autumn," the deep blue background, scattered in yellow and orange highlights slim, cavorting invented animal life. The orange and green ribbons in "Harvest" intercept bright yellow tangles on veiled green and orange backdrop. Barnett's lively color and abstract movement actually vibrate!

Michael Chamblee's "After Hours," acrylic /paper, reflects the emerging of nighttime in New York City. This familiar scene, knowingly rendered in black and white, artfully offers a vivid glimpse of Chamblee's love of the city. Noticed in all his paintings, buildings hug together, people in the street stop to chat, and sporadic linear horizontal lines knit the action. "RB-S," acrylic/paper work, exhibits jazz on piano, horns, strings, drums, and set-ups. Viewers are invited to listen, dance and swing to the music. Chamblee leads!

Margarita Ballister gives us "Peaceful Dreaming," watercolor, mixed media, an enchanting, delightful doily gracefully painted in wines, purple, blue floral design. Now...observe, a profile with deep red lips competing with a perky butterfly perched on the left. Somehow tiny scattered sparkles connect this lovely circle of surrounding petals and wee flowers, "Garden of Hope," a sister palette, highlights three butterflies renewing life among the blossoms surrounded by flowers.

Frieda Christofides' "Rose Garden," watercolor/paper, depicts a charming old fashioned rose garden, which we still enjoy. Flowered hoops offset darting roses below, greeting summertime. In "Washington Square Park," a blooming tree offsets buildings, perfumes the breeze and counterpoises nearby greenery. This artist's brushwork inspires Mother Nature!

**Dennis Wunderlin**'s mixed media "Vissi D'arte" ably represents Tosca, Puccini's tragic opera melodrama. The center artwork displays screaming white eruptions, fiery backdrop, and reveals situations crowded with drama and sensation. The focus is maintained by purple, gold, and red geometric cuts surrounding eruptions. A wide figured cross-bar warns us. In "L'age D'or," a bold geometric mixed media work, an inverted white S in the upper left brilliantly guides us onto rear turquoise rectangles and olive/dark green, often lowered, stop offs. Strong!

**Georgianna Grantham** offers "King & Queen," an acrylic/glitter/canvas. Created first royalty portrait appropriately etched in gold, a unique royalty line devised by WSAC artist. In "Black Birds," black glitter on canvas, black birds fly up high with ease; I hear them flapping in the breeze. Can't release my eyes from staring at Grantham's flight! Bravo!

Xenia Garamvolgyi's "Water Lilies," oil/canvas, is a lovely rendering of fresh young water lilies. We catch them released from soft lime and silver green lily pads, floating easily upon haunting, luminous blue inlet. Garamvoglyi's lilies show selection and love as perceived in her admired people portraits. Her brushwork and sensitivity are

Marianne McNamara presents "Dora Wants To Tango Just One More Time," oil/canvas. McNamara often invades our lives with remembrance; Dora certainly does! Garbed in really yellow-green, her reminiscence of trim tango sequence and present portrait is biting. This artist's life drawing, color sense, composition and subjects are always "true to life." Most award paints what we know and don't often show! Her artistry suggests we feel better when we learn to laugh at ourselves.

**Petronia Paley**'s "Golden Lady: Nana with Tignon Series #1," mixed media/gold leaf/Chinese herbs on wood, is a unique portrait. Freely placed parts conjure up this unusual figure. Black hair, gloves and skirt appear made of paper. Her shiny pink shoulder flounce draws immediate notice. The two dimension surface includes a horned animal and skirt top below belly. Paley often shows provocative work.

Silvia Soares Boyer's "Melody for Tri-Colour Pandora" used uni-ball/coloured pencils on engineering paper. Pandora's portrait appearance is frequent in WSAC exhibits. Engineering paper indeed flatters her image. Intertwined triangle purple-blue hair ribbons, on both sides of her face, enhance her blonde tresses in a well organized design. Welcome back Pandora! In "Tributute to Free Masonry," acrylic/uni-ball/pens and cloth on grey paper, Soares seeks clever geometric design from Masonic secret ancient society reaching back to Biblical era.

Daniel C. Boyer's "The Ancient Gentleman in the Reducing Square Watches His Town Disappear" is gouache over pencil on wood panel. Boyer's "man," I believe, plays different roles cavorting in Boyer's work. See the panel's sky and orange shades below, heating gentleman's piano, creating his journey. The figure behind, head-hooked into wiggly blue wire, assists or imitates the master. The toothy guy in a blue bow tie manages the orange backdrop as activity flourishes. "The Illegitimate Republic" is acrylic gouache & clickable pen over invisible ink on unprimed hardboard wood panel. Perhaps the republic's illegitimate leader's rule results in the distressed wild flower night garden, as appears in this painting.

In "Autumn Prelude," mixed media on canvas, **Joseph Healy**'s supposed darkened roof top reflects reduced in size geometric objects, perhaps for use in conjunction with building materials. In any case, the busy fascinating design touched with off whites and greyed gold presents an examination of a moving image of industrial design.

This exhibit demonstrates the triumph of sprit imbued in WSAC artists to maintain our intimate gallery during this
