## Margaret Montgomery Rainy Day


Watercolor & gouache on paper 26" X 38"

The white façade of the Guggenheim is particularly sensitive to changing light: Visibly changing color from white to yellow, to orange, pink and greyish violet depending on the time of day and the weather.----demonstrating just how illusory perception can be!

This work is from an earlier series expressing my obsession with Fire Hydrants.



## Daniel Boyer On Wall Street Gouache and red wine stain remover on Eaton® Corrasable® Bond 11" x 8-1/2"



On Wall Street is painted using gouache and red wine stain remover on Eaton Corrasable® Bond. Red wine stain remover is, as the name suggests, a substance or perhaps several types of substances for getting stains made by red wine out of fabric (in this case it is a spray), but rather than using it for its intended purpose I have put it to work in painting. Eaton Corrasable® Bond is a brand of specially-coated typewriting paper so designed that, if one makes a mistake in typing, one can erase it using an eraser, and then type another letter or letters where was the mistake.

The art that I create is inspired by the color, texture, condition of the materials that I find, and how I manipulate them. The piece comes to life through a creative process, and a connection with a higher power that leads my way. Nothing is planned, it is a happening.
