
A World In Disarray







The group is kept to a limit of 12 people for a personal, custom experience. Clare demystifies watercolor with easy-to-understand painting lessons for beginners to intermediate. Silvia gave Cabaret concerts at ABSW on July 21st & August 29th and will have one on September 26th. She is going to participate in the 2023 London International Music Awards, London UK, and at the 2023 AIMA - Amadeus International Music Awards, Salzburg, Austria both in Professional Voice/Piano; and was a recipient of a Rauschenberg Foundation Award Grant, in partnership with New York Foundation for the Arts.
