After perusing the outside of the curious little Beaux-Arts building, on the island of 96 St. & Broadway, numerous times, I finally strolled in. The work on the walls impressed me, as did the members running the organization. This, adding to my desire to find a local space to exhibit, encouraged my joining the WSAC in 2001. Enjoying the camaraderie of other artists and sharing in community, led to further involvement as co-chair of the Fine Arts. By 2006, I took over as Fine Arts Chair. I am always on the lookout for artists as possible new members. I'm in charge of organizing show dates and finding and guiding curators for all Fine Arts Exhibits at the gallery, as well as outside shows. I curate three to four shows each year and attend monthly board meetings, while also collecting and organizing content and material for the WSAC Newsletter and Website.

Art has always been an essential in my life. I Studied at Queens College. Receiving a scholarship to Pratt Institute, I majored in Fine Arts, graduating with a BFA. Deciding to teach art professionally, I went to Teacher's College and later studied at China Institute. My husband and I adopted a Korean baby; soon after, I accepted co-presidency of an organization of four hundred families who had adopted Korean children. The five years I held this position expanded my organizational skills that have benefited me as WSAC's Fine Arts Chair and will continue to benefit me as Acting Vice President.

I have been a member of WSAC for many years, with increasing involvement in this organization. Originally I joined in order to have opportunities to exhibit my work, but beyond this I was impressed by its being a gallery open to all, run by the artists, and reaching out to the community as well as to members.

As Membership Chair for the past six years, I am responsible for processing applications, issuing membership cards, sending out renewal reminders, answering inquiries, maintaining and sharing membership lists with the Board, and attending monthly Board meetings. In the past I served on the Public Relations Committee, and presently act as Proofreader for the Newsletter. I have been curating or co-curating fine arts shows two or three times a year, and enjoy the interaction with participating artists and the creative potential of this endeavor.

Jean Prytyskacz Photography Chair

Jean Prytyskacz has been a WSAC member since 2002. She has been involved in photography for over 20 years. She is mostly self-taught, taking courses whenever she can. Jean attended the SUC at Buffalo for journalism and has worked for various publications and companies over the years. She also attended the New York Film Academy to pursue filmmaking.

Jean has co-chaired photography with David Ruskin (now retired from WSAC), since spring 2004. She has curated numerous photography shows at the Broadway Mall and several other venues. Some of these venues were: Licht Blick Gallery on LI, a Williamsburg loft, the Manhattan Borough President's Office, the Countee Cullen and the Tompkins Square libraries, and the American Youth Hostel. She also initiated the WSAC involvement with (Symphony Space's) Upper West Fest and the (LES BID) Lower Feast Side. Jean also represented the WSAC on the steering committee for the Upper West Fest, during 2007-2008.

Judith Davidoff has been the music chair for WSAC since 2004. She arranges interludes of live music for those exhibit curators who desire them. The performances usually take place at the closing of the exhibits. They often share programs with our poetry group. Commentary about the instruments and the music accompanies the music, which spans six centuries. Ms. Davidoff is the artistic director of the New York Consort of Viols.

Judith Davidoff, cellist and violist da gamba, began her concert career in Boston, before moving to New York at the invitation of Noah Greenberg, director of the famed early music ensemble, the New York Pro Musica Antiqua. Since then she has performed and taught on five continents. She has been given an Alumnae Recognition award by Radcliffe College, a Lifetime Achievement award by the Viola da Gamba Society of America, and an Outreach Award by Early Music America for her work with young students. She earned her PhD. Degree from the Union Institute, where she created a catalogue of contemporary works for the viola da gamba.

I, Carolyn Reus became a member of the West Side Arts Coalition in 2006, around the same time that I started going to the Riverside Library Branch poetry workshops or readings. Members of the Riverside group are also encouraged to submit poetry that may be published in the West Side Arts Coalition's newsletter.
