In Memoriam

Meyer Tannenbaum 1918 - 2014





It is with great sadness that the West Side Arts Coalition announces the passing of Meyer Tannenbaum, one of the seminal influences in the creation and continuation

of the WSAC. Meyer was our mentor and long time board member wearing many different hats throughout the years to keep the coalition alive. He was an original, both as a person and as an artist who championed non-objective abstract painting without the use of the brush. He was an inspired and renowned artist, exploring the boundaries of color and expression and studied at the Pennsylvania Academy of Fine Art and the Barnes Institute in Philadelphia. His work is in private collections and has been

shown in museums and galleries around the world.



Meyer's contributions and influence on the WSAC were inestimable. His strength sustained the organization and his knowledge about art broadened all members' abilities. He will be greatly missed and is irreplaceable.

Funeral services were held January 22nd in Erie, PA.

A Gift of Art 2013 (Continued from Page 1)

Lynn Lieberman's three lively watercolors welcome the viewer into the show. Lieberman's handling of this often unforgiving medium is confident and beguiling. "St Paul's Chapel, Columbia University" is a lovely portrait of that iconic building while "Broadway & 113th St." is a charming view of a typical UWS street. The rendering of "Central Park" from 59th St to 110th St is astonishing in its detail. It is such great fun to pick out one's favorite statues, gardens, etc.

Quickly stirring up the diversity of the show, **Robin Goodstein** brings three electric oil abstracts to the Mall. In her two small works, "Yellow Series I" and "Yellow Series II", each canvas explodes with vibrant colors on delicious yellow backgrounds. Goodstein shows her versatility in the abstract venue with a large painting using almost calligraphic random lines and shapes of bright color. Wide margins of white canvas further enhance the drama of this piece titled "Rational Exuberance."

Four pieces by **Jennifer Lenn** bring the viewer into a gentle world of interiors and still lifes. "The Blue Room" is softly captured in a monotype/collage. It isn't difficult to imagine friends settling down to tea and talk in this lovely room. "Wedding Apples" is a spirited monotype still life and the aptly named "Whimsy", is another delightful combo of monotype and collage. While "Sophie's Eggs" is a definite move towards an abstract monotype, it is most winningly an egg box with multi-colored eggs!

Danguole Raudonikiene's "Windy Evening" took this visitor about 3 seconds to be delighted by a windmill, a tree and a fence whirling through the blue sky while a docile horse stands firmly on the ground, perhaps thinking about munching on some tasty looking flowers nearby. "Flowers for You" is a color-drenched still life and "Fir Trees Near the Barn", with its bright foliage and gaggle of ducks must invoke many sweet memories to anyone who grew up in the country.

Two fascinating totem-like wall sculptures by **Gail Atherton** are powerful in their strong, yet simple design. In "Goldfish Crackers", the larger of the two pieces, mounted on masonite and canvas, Atherton applies almost triangular shapes of orange with striated lines of light blue against the deep brown of the masonite. In "Untitled" she uses the same technique with blue on black for great dramatic effect.

Gail Comes is no stranger to the WSAC walls. Her highly dramatic, iconic paintings have mesmerized audiences at any exhibition where her work is shown. This painting, "Silver Knight", is a huge work which will surely invoke many different interpretations. It is a masterful oil drawing with a simple palette of grey, white, black and light brown. And who isn't intrigued by the face in the ear???

The variety of this marvelous exhibition continues with a lovely small still life, "Parma Violet" by Catherine Silver. A beautiful flower is always a delight but a beautiful flower in close-up offers the viewer a special intimate moment. Silver brings other works to the Mall: "Flower Opening in the Sun", "Chinese Meditation", "Singing an American Bird Song" and "Fish Under Water". All of these unusual works were done in the very special medium of encaustic on wood.

In **Joseph Healy's** gripping collage, "Two Scholars", many stories seem to be unfolding at once. This is a dramatic piece on many levels. The artist worked with papers of varying colors, shapes and sizes. Then he skillfully attached the papers to form a cohesive and bold work of art. But it doesn't seem to end there - there seem to be many stories unfolding in the piece. What are they? Perhaps the viewer will find his or her own

From afar, this viewer thought Richard Carlson's work "Please Touch" was done on wood. What a great surprise to see this remarkable piece is actually a collage. It is a large, striking work of great intricacy. The background of the collage is a glowing brown with a vibrant turquoise stripe running down one side of the work. One can almost feel the small pieces of collage rippling across the support.

Linda Lessner's gifts as a landscape pastel artist have been enjoyed by viewers at the Mall for a number of years. "Rocky Cove - Penobscot Bay" and "Ulster County Summer" are prime examples of the pleasures of pastel paintings in the right hands. Not one to rest on her pastel laurels, Lessner's, "Autumn Grasses" is a luscious oil painting so redolent of knee-high grass that one longs to walk into the painting.

Another faithful WSAC artist is Jutta Filippelli. When I first met Jutta at the Mall years ago, she was an artist committed to realism. Her slice of life paintings, carefully done, were universally admired. In the last several years, this wonderful artist has been given challenges which could have pulled the plug on any more creative work. Her hearing became more compromised. And then - any artist's nightmare - she began to lose her sight. What could she do? Stop painting? If you want to know Jutta's answer check out her three lively, color-saturated abstract paintings, - "Soft Colors, "As I See It", and "See What You Will". Can't see well enough to do the realistic work anymore? No problem, pick up that brush and create an abstract painting. All artists are brave. Some are heroic.

Adrienne Cosner's contributions to this remarkable show are two acrylic cityscapes. "Red Sky at Night" is a haunting work where the silhouetted skyline of the city lies low on the canvas and the brilliant early night sky is the star of the show. "St. Petersburg, Russia" evokes a somber serenity suddenly brought to life by the dazzling blue water moving through the canal. One can imagine that in an hour or so this scene will be alive with people.

If the words "mixed media" still invoke confusion, take a look at the startling work by Joseph Boss and never be confused again! The problem with "mixed media" is that it isn't always in the hands of a gifted artist. Not to worry, this time it is. "Spilling News #1 and Spilling News #2 are truly works of great sophistication and dare I say it - humor! Boss' third mixed media painting is "Untitled" and it is another accomplished piece from this artist, this time using a primarily green palette with dramatic touches of yellow, blue and interesting outlines in black.

It is a rare challenge to show such diversity in a small gallery. Brava to curator Linda Lessner for hanging the show so that every artist is a star and all the work cohabits harmoniously around the walls.
