




Myrna Harrison-Changar uses matte colors to create a swirly series of oil paintings, lending an impression almost of experimental photography or of patterned rocks. The whirled intensity of these works is outstanding.

Beatrice Rubel's "Square and Round" reconciles the geometric and biomorphic currents often at odds in modern abstraction; there is something very alluring in her choice of red and green as the colors of life

Sonia Barnett's dynamic small square canvases in a range of striking colors create an enigmatic space in which calligraphy mingles with botanical ideations.

Meg Boe Birns' globed chicken and sprightly fish are colorful sculptural mixed-media representations that convey the esoteric joy in the life of all things in the world.

Richard Carlson's conceptual, minimalist "Domino" magically transforms a familiar game piece into something something of great metaphysical significance.

Jack Cesareo's wonderful Duchampian brio is once again evident in his miniature assemblage commemorating his remarkable crosscountry trip with his iconic pink cupcake and bicycle.
