#### Free Expression 2012

Heading off this delightfully diverse group of painters is Anne Rudder and her one painting, "Inner Garden," which just happens to be all about artistic freedom of expression. Rudder's expert use of watercolor is always a treat to the eye and her inventive use of gossamer lines in this painting is mesmerizing in how the lines pull everything together giving the viewer a special moment in an idyllic, primeval environment rampant with its strange plant and insect life.

The curator of the show, **Sonia Barnett**, shows a haunting acrylic, "Somewhere Else." The painting pulls the viewer into this mysterious world of bold shapes and colors. It's a truly other worldly place but where? In the forest, underwater, are those cliffs of red clay??? Barnett continues to jar us out of our comfort zone with another acrylic, "Struggle." On a stark white canvas, the push and pull of bold blue lines dangling precariously on a vertical line tells the human story better than words.

Herbert Evans brings a different measure of mystery to "The Birth of Autumn," an acrylic work imbued with artifacts from another time. A partially hidden stone icon and a startling blue totem invite the viewer into this strange but peaceful forest coming alive again in Autumn. Evans' monochromatic oil "Outside of Eden" captures the special experience of wandering through luscious Eden-like greenery.

Three oil and collage works by Leanne Martinson, "Black Star," "Black Star #1," and "Black Star #2," bring an explosion of shape and color to the walls. Employing collage and paint in daring but obviously well thought-out patterns on white canvas, the works are visible testimony to Martinson's gift for the enduring drama of abstraction. The three pieces fairly dance on the wall!

Lula Ladson takes us into a gentle world of manicured lawns, stately old trees, lovely flowering bushes in "Inner Peace." Then she gives us a tranquil stroll under a bower of trees, the sun providing a dappled walkway in "Shine." Ladson's third oil brings us indoors with her strong and colorful, "Still Life."

An "Untitled" work by Nate Ladson hangs alone on the back wall of the gallery. It's a show stopper! Rife with symbolism, the painting evokes all kinds of interpretations from viewers. Only Ladson knows the real story and frankly, this viewer was perfectly satisfied to come up with her own!!! The large work is done with expert precision, a hallmark of Ladson's style. In a completely different mode (or mood) is Ladson's "Mood Changes." This impressionistic work in diaphanous shades of pinks, blues, purples is as transcendent in its own way as Ladson's "Untitled" piece is in its way.

**Jutta Filippelli**, a long-time member of the WSAC and known as a painter of charming realistic scenes of family life and landscapes, switched gears a few years ago and started her new artistic life as an abstract painter. The evidence of her amazing rebirth is on the wall with two lively and brilliantly colored acrylic works "Abstract #1" and "Abstract #2." "#1" is a balance of sensuous amorphous shapes in vivid colors while "#2" is a witty display of random shapes and bright colors on a stark black background.

The halcyon days of summer, when life seems to move at a lovely snail's pace, are captured by **Robert Eckel** in three of his four paintings, "Beach Book 2," "Bow Bridge," and "Texting." One can feel the air, soft and dreamlike. In "Honey Boo-Boo," Eckel gives us a witty take on a contemporary summer activity with a child industriously doing a chalk drawing of tv's latest reality star. In Eckel's hands, these four acrylics have a lustrous oil quality.

Arlene Finger enriches the wall with just one work, "Mother and Child." Boldly painted in brilliant mixed media primary colors, this large painting is an interesting mixture of contemporary and primitive styles which come together in a provocative painting of a familiar religious theme.

Another artist who likes to stir the artistic pot is **Amy Rosenfeld** with two mixed media works, "Sandy" and "Chocolate Candy Bar Bitten." In "Sandy," Rosenfeld uses text within the painting to further tell the tragic story of the recent hurricane. Her second painting needs no explanation! It's an homage to America's love affair with the candy bar.

Emily Rich is a long-time presence at the WSAC, who continues to bewitch us with her use of color and shape in four vibrant abstract paintings. "Wild Wind," an aptly titled mixed media work on a black background, portrays the power and possible danger of nature. "Landscape," a collage also done on a black background with a vivid acrylic palette, gives us nature perhaps in a more seductive mood. Rich's "Black & White Series #30" and "Black & White Abstract with Red," are compelling with their basically grey palettes and startling hints of color.

"The Parallel Monster" is **Daniel C. Boyer's** title for this work done by finger painting - yes, I said finger painting. This colorful and whimsical work complete with a rather benign looking blue monster is clearly the work by an artist who knows his colors and shapes and knows how to bring a lively balance to the whole process. Boyer's second painting, an abundantly blue acrylic titled "The Prime Ministers of the Acerbic at the Samurais Picnic," employs the use of pencil, the script and images spilling imaginatively onto the white frame.

**Silvia Soares Boyer** brings one provocative and lyrical painting to the gallery, an acrylic titled "A Blue Symphony for Pandora." Who doesn't enjoy a painting which can tell so many stories? Who is the mystery woman? Where is she? Palm trees linger in the background and musical notes complete the story - whatever that story is for this lovely damsel.

The title, "Free Expression 2012," was obviously taken very seriously by all the artists in this free-wheeling and tantalizing show. Bravos to all for a wonderful burst of color on these grey winter days.
