Marie Robison's "Passages," applied paper collage, reveals a series of slender layered rectangles pressed upon a heavenly blue mat. Left side features royal purple doorway framed in mellow lavender, guarded by taller panel, point-brushed in Robison's unusual, awesome floral style. Soon, drawn into gauzy rear forestry, stillness awakens my ear to the call of a gurgling brook. "From Nature," a flowery collage, embraces creamy yellow, generous petal blooms, comfortably floating upon deep green-blue tint. Robison's methods are subtly unique!

Nate Ladson's large masterly pastel works exhibit once again a searching departure from past oil paintings. "The Transformation of Color" is adept in the abstract inclusion of color intuition. Autumn orange-yellow mix provides Ladson's vivid experience with movement and play of sky-stream reflection. "A Streak of Blue" is focused on a single tall, bold line stroke, coupled with a mysterious animal form (Egyptian origin?), against glowing orange grounds. Ladson's endeavor to explore sustains his artistry.

Marguerite Borchardt invites us to bring in the season as suggested by her four timely oil paintings. "Bridge at Cognac" visits a geometric skilled variety of Borchardt's strengths. Her painterly greenery catches my eye under the soft grey bridge. "Flowers" offers a joyful pot of blooms created by this WSAC garden artist to stimulate broad smiles from fellow artists and gallery visitors.

Daniel Boyer's trio artworks are introduced in gouache and acrylic. Boyer sweeps, scrambles, strokes and plays hide & seek with familiar inclusions on a mid-color painted canvas. Observation of "The Deer Park," the larger work, evokes a peerless puzzling path. Tracing the deer's gaze leads to doggies roadmap and further conundrum through Boyer's fun-forest. Two 6"x4" canvas works serve to interpret "Orangutans Relate..." and "Sad, Dark Skeletons...," exquisitely executed. Boyer's composition, upbeat design, and humor indicate his multi-faceted artistry.

Amy Rosenfeld's weather works welcome forthcoming season change. "Beach Scene" relives sandy trips as bright blue overhead cradles Rosenfeld's "shell sun" for toasting. "Rebirth of Spring" reaches out to ensure its arrival, displaying a boldly constructed flower in squinty sun-drenched yellow, sporting bright red/orange petals balanced on a sturdy pink stem. Rosenfeld is WSAC's seasoned fun artist.

Peter Schepper's oil paint studies of major rock stars are deftly drawn, so audacious I heard their raps. "Car Crash Framed" was noisy too. The inclusion of public service art "is where it gets noticed," says Peter. "Fight Breast Cancer," his vital collage depicting Pegasus, the winged miracle horse, and "Wonder Bread," framed in furry hot pink, are well-timed and impressive. Schepper is WSAC's 21st century art reporter.

Silvia Soares Boyer's uncommon "Mythical World of Pandora Goddess II" catapults our outlook to the 21st century. Penetrating black canvas, networked in gold, silver and crystal symbols, confirms the legendary narrative of mythology. Mounted center, a small painted rose/purple female head a la Picasso completes the tale. Boyer's artistry deserves study to sincerely appreciate her finely etched line and narrative references.

Adrienne Cosner shows three acrylic paintings. "Mayan Dance" moves me to the drum beat after stop/ go notes. "The Highlands of Scotland" truly prompts a visit. Mosaic rock formations, often moss carpeted, slope gently downward to meet icy, sapphire blue water. Crowds of red blossoms nestle just above sea rocks as pointy green snow-capped highlands reach to breathy heights. Cosner's variety of themes provides viewers with enrichment and further interest.

Dammika D. Ranasinghe's four original acrylic on canvas paper designs comprise engaging spirit and her continued flowering talent. "Spring Arrives in 2015" displays lilting repeated yellow, orange, blue and green blossom symbols, remarkably created. Ranasinghe's nature inspired painting visually springs from the wall! Her intricate pattern appears as a wondrous feat. "Garden Covered with Briza Maxima" captures the strength of brazen green growth seeking life. I am enchanted!

Dimuthu Ranasinghe's art reflects her origins. Her four small paintings reveal the artist at one with Nature. "Shining Sparks" shows busy throngs of blue-green darts swarming in lavender space. Shooting from midpoint, orange darts crowd the exit as bright green and deep red dart fragments close in. "Temple Flower," in subtle tones of green, deep red and lavender, describes a powerful method of composing this strong flowered plant. Ranasinghe's new approach is so different. I can't wait to see more.

Ba Djibril Ngawa's contribution presents an enthusiastic variety to WSAC's spring exhibit. Ngawa's marvelous brushwork, painted in people tones, presents humanity caught in the tangles of jostling and quick passage in a crowded environment. The painting reminds us, "Mixed Crowd" is big city world wide experience. Ancestral Communication's" glorious transparent lively blue brushwork, lower center, tweaked with various searching antennas, seems to be visited by message seekers. Another Ngawa work sensitively defines fluttering, lucent green stalks, nourished by sunlight, enjoying the essence of its title, "Growth." The artist's last statement fully describes the inclusive gestures in all his work. Palest blue slips in to mix and jumble around rose shaded ribbon loops, declaring Ngama's title of "Movement."

A privilege it is, to review this uplifting springtime celebration. Commenting upon the work of participating artists provides insight into their creativity.
